WINDERMERE PARTICIPATES IN CLEANUP AT MOUNTAIN BASE



Staff members of Windermere Anthem Hills and Windermere Prestige Properties participated Oct. 16 in Windermere's Annual Community Service Day initiative. This year's project consisted of a cleanup effort at the Great Unconformity, a geological site at the base of the Frenchman (Sunrise) Mountain. It is called the Great Unconformity because it represents a 1.2 billion-year gap — about one-fourth of the Earth's geologic history — which appears to be missing between the rock layers. Windermere adopted this geological site located on the east side of Las Vegas. More than 30 Windermere staff members completely filled a construction dumpster with litter, carpet scraps, glass and bits of furniture. Panera Bread (The District location) donated bagels, pastries and fresh coffee to the volunteers. Windermere's Community Service Day: Making our neighborhoods better places to live, was established in 1984. All Windermere agents and staff dedicate one day each year to work together on neighborhood improvement projects. In the last 25 years of Community Service Day, Windermere associates and staff have volunteered more than a half million hours of service to help improve communities.
